Dear Oak Grove Lutheran Elementary School Families,

In just a little over a month, we will be again hosting our Spelling Bee for our elementary students here at Oak Grove in grades 1 through 5. This is a voluntary activity and is sent home in the event your student wishes to participate. It is not a requirement. We are going to again post a list of words that are recommended for each grade level to review and study. While we want all of our students to enjoy their Christmas vacation, there may be some opportunities to look over the words and perhaps study them when they have some extra time. We have been sending a list of words home now for a couple of years during this time and have had some very positive feedback about that.

The 2018 Spelling Bee schedule is as follows:

Primary Spelling Bee—Grades 1, 2—Preliminary Test—January 19th, 2018.
Primary Spelling Bee--Grades 1, 2-- Finalists Bee--January 25th, 2018 @ 1:45 p.m.

Intermediate Spelling Bee—Grades 3,4,5—Preliminary Test—January 19th, 2018.
Intermediate Spelling Bee—Grades 3,4,5—Finalists Bee—January 26th, 2018 @ 1:30 p.m.

During the finals, parents are invited to watch the children perform.

Our Spelling Bee is patterned after the Scripps National Spelling Bee rules. Scripps has sponsored spelling bees both nationally and internationally since the 1920's when the first bees were held in our nation. Due to the timing of our Spelling Bee, there is not an opportunity to advance beyond our school bee for Scripps.

How do the children use the study guide?

Recommendation—A 1st grade child should study his/her recommended list and could study the 2nd and 3rd grade list. A child in grades 3,4,5 should study their grade level list and may challenge themselves to study the words on the lists that go beyond their grade level. In preparation for the actual Bee, a primary student will be asked to study only the words through grade 3. Students who are in grades 3,4,5 should study the words in their grade levels and also study the words from the lists for grades 3,4,5. The only exception for these recommendations is if children from

either category far exceeded our expectations and more difficult words had to be utilized from the harder lists that are found in this packet.
